Perseverance Pumpkin Bulletin Board



Talk about perseverance. What is it? What does it mean? How can someone persevere?

Perseverance doesn't look the same for everyone. Encourage your students to think of a specific time they persevered.

Have your student(s) write one way they persevere on the pumpkin. Display on a bulletin board or have your student(s) color the pumpkin and take it home as a reminder of how good it feels to persevere!

Ways to use the bulletin board:

Print out each individual page on different color papers (orange for the pumpkin, green for the leaf, brown for the stem). Cut out each individual piece and glue them together.


Print out each individual page on white paper & have students color their own.




